*A team's total points were determined by adding the following points:*

- 1) Multiplying a team's winning % by 10.
- 2) Multiplying a team's losing % by -10.
- 3) 25 points for a two-loss or a one loss/one tie season.
- 4) 50 points for a one-loss or no-loss/one-tie season.
- 5) 100 points for a Championship Season (AP or Coaches Polls).
- 6) Minus 25 points for a losing season, minus 50 for no win season.
- 7) Finally, a team's points were normalized to Nebraska's total points.

**Nebraska holds the longest consecutive non-losing record in major college football at 42 years.**
